Emergency Action Plan (EAP)

Field Location: Overpeck County Park

200 Roosevelt Place, Palisades Park, NJ 07650

Purpose

This Emergency Action Plan (EAP) provides clear guidance for responding promptly, calmly, and effectively to medical emergencies, severe weather, and security threats during practices, games, and league events. The safety of players, volunteers, families, and spectators is our highest priority.

Section 1 — Medical Emergencies

When in doubt — call 911.

- Stop play immediately.
- Call 911 for unconsciousness, severe bleeding, difficulty breathing, chest pain, head/neck injuries, seizures, or suspected broken bones.
- Provide the location: Overpeck County Park, 200 Roosevelt Place, Palisades Park, NJ 07650.
- Provide First Aid if trained (CPR/AED if available).
- Do not move the injured person unless they are in immediate danger.
- Contact parent/guardian as soon as possible.
- Document the incident after it is resolved.

Section 2 — Severe Weather

- If thunder is heard or lightning is seen, suspend play immediately.
- Move everyone to a fully enclosed building or inside vehicles.
- Wait 30 minutes after the last thunder/lightning before resuming play.
- Provide frequent water breaks during extreme heat.
- Stop play during high winds or severe storms and move to safe shelter.

Section 3 — Security Threats

- Report suspicious activity to League Officials and call 911 if necessary.
- Do not confront suspicious individuals.
- In case of a missing child, alert League Officials immediately and call 911 if not located quickly.
- Remove players from any disturbance or unsafe situation.

Section 4 — General Guidelines

- Keep a charged cell phone on site at all times.
- Know the facility address for emergency responders.
- Maintain access to player emergency contact information.
- Remain calm and communicate clearly.
- Report all serious incidents to League leadership within 24 hours.
